

# Staff and Volunteer Training

Over the past month, staff and volunteers have taken part in Volunteer Induction training, Community Fridge training, DWP Personal Independence Payment training and further training on our accounts system.

#### Which areas of Ludlow did we reach last year?



At the end of each year, we take time to reflect to allow us to plan, focus and adapt. One thing we would like to share with you right now is that we worked with 602 individuals (not including those who use the community fridge) and 100 active volunteers. We worked hard in 2024 to understand the spread of engagement across town and to check we weren't missing out any areas.

The map to the side, shows the area of

Ludlow where we have worked with individuals, beneficiaries (blue) and volunteers (orange). It is reassuring to see just how many different areas we are already working and engaging with in one way or another, regardless of socio-economic status. This map and data allow us to see the areas we have not been hitting well, or at all. We hope to be reaching these areas as 2025 progresses.

# Reminder to register to vote if you haven't already

Local elections will be held in the Shropshire Council area on Thursday 1<sup>st</sup> May 2025. To be able to have your say, you must be registered to vote. If you aren't already registered, the deadline is midnight on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> April. You only need to register once, not for every election.

You can register online via the link <u>here</u> (you will be asked for your National Insurance number, but you can still register if you do not have one). This usually takes around 5 minutes. Alternatively, you can register using a paper form which you will need to print, fill in and send the form to your electoral registration office.

#### Ludlow Parkinson's Support Group



World Parkinson's Day is on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> April, a day to shine a spotlight on

Parkinson's and bring the community together. Around 153,000 people live with Parkinson's in the UK, and it is the fastest growing neurological condition in the world.

There is a group in Ludlow which offers friendship and support to all those living with Parkinson's, their carers and family. The group meet on a monthly basis at either Clifton Court (Old Street, SY8 1TZ) or The Clive Arms (Bromfield, SY8 2JR). Recently, they met up with the Church Stretton Group and had a talk from Community Resource on falls awareness and how to make your house safer. The group are hoping to take a trip out to the Long Mynd and Stiper Stones later this year, and some members are off to the races in April.
