High Sheriff Award

On the evening of 19 January, Volunteer Coordinator Teresa and Trustee Graham attended a special presentation ceremony at Telford Fire Station, where Hands Together Ludlow were officially awarded a High Sheriff Award.

Hands Together was one of a number of organisations chosen by this year's High Sheriff, Jane Trowbridge, in recognition of the vital work being carried out to support local communities.



Speaking after the ceremony, Teresa said: "I am so proud to have collected this award on behalf of all our Volunteers, who give so much to ensure our services and projects can continue, providing support to our community. Thank you everyone."

We are incredibly grateful and honoured to have received this award and thank everyone who contributes to making Hands Together a wonderful place to be.

Where does our food waste goes?

In 2025, we received an incredible 16.2 tonnes of surplus food (16,200 kg) that had been generously donated to our Community Fridge, of which we were able to redistribute 13.5 tonnes back to the community. We are very lucky that a large proportion of the surplus we receive can be used directly in our weekly community lunches and other food projects. In 2025, Hands Together used 951kg for these projects.

The surplus donations we receive are from supermarkets, farmers, smaller shops and other growers. Some of the items are past their 'best before' date, which only means that they might be less than perfect, but are still safe and edible. However, if we are inundated with surplus, and last year we were at different times: there was a bumper crop of apples for instance, we may have to discard some of the food. Even after freezing, cooking, making soup and so on, we do have a surplus of surplus!

Thankfully, rather than putting this into the waste system we have a wonderful partnership with a local farmer on Clee Hill. Sheralee and her son Tobi come to us weekly and collect anything and everything to feed their livestock, pigs, sheep and chickens. We are delighted with this arrangement as it really does keep the food being used in a meaningful way.



The launch of Meals Made Easy

We are very excited to announce the launch of our new recipe book, Meals Made Easy, developed in collaboration with Ludlow Town Council as part of the Shaping Places for Healthier Lives Project.

Our Food Projects Coordinator, Julia, has curated, with the help of Volunteers, 50 practical and accessible recipes, designed to support a wide range of our community. The recipes are grouped into the following categories: **Store Cupboard Essentials, Food for One, Family Favourites, Type 2 Diabetes and Food Intolerances** (Dairy-Free and Gluten Free).



The aim of the project Shaping Places, of which 'Meals Made Easy' is the result, was to provide some support and encouragement for those in our community who do not regularly cook at home. All the recipes are designed to be simple, often only using one pot, healthy and inexpensive. To support this, video tutorials are available for a selection of recipes and can be viewed via the [Hands Together website](#). Digital versions of the recipe cards are also available online.
