

Happy 10th Anniversary



David Harlington, a founding Trustee, is retiring and recalls with pleasure and bemusement the ups and downs of HANDS TOGETHER LUDLOW during the last decade.

"Ludlow struggled with the aftermath of the 2008 financial crisis. Concerned folk tried to come to terms with life during the years of austerity – much of which was written about. Many different views were debated on what should best be done to help our community.

HANDS TOGETHER LUDLOW – it started with an idea in August 2013. Cathy Pritchard and I got together and developed some concrete practical proposals which were presented to the churches in Ludlow in December 2013. On June 4th, 2014, HANDS TOGETHER LUDLOW was launched at a public meeting in

the Methodist Church. It had taken a year to develop the idea into an acceptable practical solution to the problem. During the first three years of the project 2014 to 2017 - a lot of moral support and practical help was given from all the churches and from the community at large and the project began to work, becoming a registered charity on March 9th 2017.

The next three years of growth: 2017 to 2020 – what it needed now was some enthusiastic fresh blood which was happily and eagerly forthcoming. The project blossomed, Sue Chantler became Chair and funding was found for an Administrator, Sarah Kellett, from the Methodist Church. The charity became well known for its influence in the community. Three years of influence: 2020 to 2023 – years of austerity were interrupted by the Covid pandemic which exacerbated the needs of the hungry and lonely in the community. A new source of young volunteers was found to supplement the existing older volunteers, who were asked to stay at home. This was a tonic for HANDS TOGETHER LUDLOW and set us up for the future.

Where are we now? The problems in society seem to be changing from austerity to levelling up, and from immigration to climate change. It makes me happy to be retiring from an organisation which possesses such energy and enthusiasm for helping our society. It is satisfying to know that Ops Manager, Susie O'Hagan espouses the same core values set out ten years ago, they still apply to the Charity today and it makes me proud to think how professional and well managed the organisation has become. I am delighted that our staff and volunteers are so enthusiastic, that our trustees and local benefactors are so dedicated and generous. I congratulate all of you who work so tirelessly to further the aims of the charity.

Now that it is time for me to retire, I am content in the knowledge that HANDS TOGETHER LUDLOW continues to fulfil community needs and is firing on all cylinders ready to tackle the next ten years. Farewell, thank you all and best wishes to everyone."

The staff and trustees of Hands Together Ludlow wish David all the very best and thanks him for his service to the community. We marked the occasion by presenting him with a plaque made by The Men's Shed.

The helpline number has been used since the first Covid-19 lockdown back in March 2020. During the height of the lockdown, calls were answered 7 days a week by an excellent team of volunteers to help with incoming enquiries. Help varied from providing food and prescription deliveries for those needing to self-isolate, liaising with other

organisations to help coordinate further support and providing a friendly ear and reassurance during these difficult times. More recently, calls received are linked to helping to encourage people to get out and about again, often linked to a befriender pairing or attending one of our weekly events.
