

Call for Community Fridge Volunteers!



Have you got a couple of hours free in the week? Would you like to give back to your community? Passionate about preventing food waste? Why not volunteer your time at our Community Fridge...

We're looking for friendly people who are comfortable and confident to engage with users and are happy weighing in and out surplus food. We have afternoon shifts (1pm-4pm) available on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Fridays, as well as morning shifts (10am-1pm) on Thursday and Friday mornings.

The role of a Community Fridge volunteer is varied and includes being the first point of contact for those visiting our building. We receive daily deliveries, by volunteers, of surplus food from supermarkets and local organisations that then need sorting, weighing in and putting out for people to take. The role also includes advising people what is available today and assisting where required.

Shaping Places

Hands Together Ludlow, in conjunction with Ludlow Town Council, have been awarded a grant to fulfil a project called Shaping Places for Healthier Lives.

The project aims to increase access to good food for all, by increasing the offering in the Hands

Together Community Fridge and the number of people accessing it. We are looking to help demystify cooking and healthy eating by creating recipes and recipe cards with support from nutritionists, as well as small workshops to help build confidence for those who need it.

We will do our best to ensure that the items used in the recipes are well balanced, inexpensive and easily sourced so that these can be used by anyone. It is recognised that a healthy eating plan is often felt to be a more expensive lifestyle and this is something we would like to try and change. Recipes will be tried and tested, researched and examined for nutritional value and particularly for cost. We will photograph, film and demonstrate the meals in workshops with a final recipe card printed and 'how to' videos created.

We are very excited to be part of such a rewarding project and will provide updates as this develops!
